VALE - JACK ZIMMER

It is with regret that we advise of the passing of former Ormond Cricket Club player Jack Zimmer who passed away suddenly in Queensland in April of this year. Jack died as a result of a fall at home.

A Life Member of both the VSDCA and the Ormond Cricket Club, Jack played in four 1st XI premierships for Ormond between seasons 1957/1958 and 1970/1971. In the 1958/1959 final against Malvern Jack scored a match winning century.

Jack joined Ormond from Fitzroy Cricket Club in 1951. Jack went on to win the Hatch Medal in season 1958/1959 (previously known as the E A Goss Medal). During that outstanding season he scored more than 400 runs and also took 46 wickets, a phenomenal all round performance.

Initially appointed as coach, Jack was universally recognized as a shrewd and firm leader. Jack captained the 1st XI for eight years commencing in 1956/1957, and later led the 2nd XI for seven years, totaling in all a club record of 17 years in a captaincy role. He took 258 wickets at the top level, along the way winning the Club Championship and four bowling average awards. Later in his career he topped the 2nd XI batting averages three times. At this stage Jack would regularly play a full round of golf in the morning before turning to cricket in the afternoon.

Jack also coached and managed several successful Ormond junior club sides, particularly at U16 level where his teams won three premierships.

Fittingly, aged 55, Jack's 370th and last senior game for Ormond was in season 1978/1979 in a final, making 63 for the club's 3rd XI.

Jack was also a well known first class baseballer, particularly with Fitzroy. Along with his passion for golf, once he finished playing cricket he became a very keen lawn bowler.

Jack's sons, Ian and Glenn, also played with Ormond. Both were dual 1st XI premiership players. One of Jack's fondest memories was playing alongside Ian in a 1st XI semi final in 1970/1971. Ian subsequently moved on to play District cricket with Prahran and Glenn became a first class umpire in Queensland.

Off field, Jack played a key role in establishing many of the rules that the VSDCA competition now incorporates at club level. Together with his wife Sadie, he took charge of organizing social activities over many years. He served on Ormond's committee for twenty-five years, was the club delegate to the VSDCA for twenty years and was awarded a VCA medallion for his services to the association.

The VSDCA along with the Ormond Cricket Club would like to again extend their condolences to the Zimmer family, in particular to wife Sadie and sons Ian and Glenn.

VALE - PAULINE ROBERTSON



The club was saddened to learn of the passing of Pauline Robertson, wife of former Life Member, committee member and player, John Robertson, after whom our Club Championship award is named.

Working side by side with John, Pauline gave great service to the club during John's time as Secretary and Treasurer. She avoided any spotlight, but provided essential support to the club's administration. In days when only a manual typewriter was used, Pauline would prepare and write up all committee minutes, annual reports and letters for the club. In addition, she hosted many club meetings at their home and provided weekly scones for afternoon teas for many years.

Always very modest, Pauline was offered but declined Life Membership with the club.

Pauline's three sons Andrew, James and David all played for many years at Ormond.

Away from cricket, Pauline was well read on a wide range of subjects taking a keen interest in historical events as well as crosswords.

Pauline passed away in March of this year, only a day before the club's senior presentation night. For several years a member of the Robertson family has attended the club's presentation night to present the major individual trophy. Despite the circumstances this year, David felt that he wanted to fulfill this commitment, and the tribute that he paid his mother was both moving and a wonderful testimony to Pauline's contribution to Ormond. Those in attendance were privileged to hear such a personal account.

VALE – JOHN BARWICK

It is with great sadness that we advise members and friends of the Ormond Cricket Club of the passing of former player, John Barwick, on Monday 2 July 2012. John was in his late 60's, and was undergoing surgery at the time for another complaint when he suffered a heart attack.

John played during the late 1950s for both the Ormond Cricket Club and the Ormond Amateur Football Club, and was a legendary Ormond personality of the 1960's and 1970's.

His father Ernie Barwick was one of the Ormond Cricket Club's original committee members who served from approximately 1948 to 1972 (and was a Life Member).

John will always be remembered as a highly intelligent individual with an extremely quick wit who made EE Gunn Reserve his second home.

ANNUAL REPORT 2011–2012

To the Members, Players and Supporters of the Ormond Cricket Club

I submit for your approval at the 65th Annual General Meeting of the Ormond Cricket Club, the Annual Report and Statement of Income and Expenditure for season 2011-2012.

Last year I wrote in the annual report that season 2010-2011, was possibly one of the most eventful seasons in the history of the Club. A lot can happen in just 12 months.

The season began very promisingly with the return of 1st XI players Sathish Prabakaran, Stewart Kimpton and Rowan Purkiss to the Club, with Sathish bringing a number of quality 1st XI and 2nd XI players. Along with the arrival of English import Lewis Johnston, the 1st XI and 2nd XI teams looked very strong and competitive.

Unfortunately, by Round 4, some of these recruits, along with several other members of the playing group were out with long-term injuries, some unavailable due to work/study commitments, and one of our recruits having to move interstate for job opportunities after only one game. This affected our playing stocks significantly, with the Club calling on several players, including juniors, to fill vacancies in the 3rd and 4th XI teams. Some of these juniors were therefore playing senior cricket a year or two earlier than the Club had originally planned. The Club was faced with the difficult prospect of not having enough players to fill all four XI's on several match days.

By the halfway mark of the season, the fortunes of the Club slowly began to improve. Thanks largely to a recruiting drive lead by Ross Singleton, several past players returned to the club in a playing capacity and with the return of some of our injured players, the Club received a much needed injection of talent to the playing ranks. The post Christmas break saw the Club become competitive and achieve a small level of success across all senior grades.

This success is highlighted in each of the senior XI's as follows:

The 1st XI produced their first and only win of the season in Round 10 against Mt Waverley, which was quite significant for the Club. Not only was the win a great result, they also had the honor of being the inaugural winners of the Ted Plant Shield, named in honor of the tremendous service given to both clubs by Ted. This Shield will now be contested in future 1st XI fixtured VSDCA games between Ormond and Mt Waverley. The 1st XI had a dramatic tie in the previous Round 9 game against Endeavour Hills, with the result coming down to the last ball. The 1st XI were competitive in matches against Bayswater in Round 5, Brighton in Round 7 and Box Hill in Round 6, where Coach and 1st XI Captain Michael Hansen, along with Club President Michael Williams had an opening partnership of 153.

The 2nd XI won two games for the season, which were back-to-back wins in Rounds 9 and 10 against Endeavour Hills and Mt Waverley. The Round 10 win highlighted by Lewis Johnston's brilliant innings of 109, acting as captain in the absence of Scott McManus. The 2nd XI also came close to making it three wins in a row, but fell agonizingly short in their Round 8 Twenty 20 game against Malvern.

The 3rd XI won two games, also back-to-back, in Rounds 8 and 9. Their first win being the first win of the season for the club against Malvern in a tense finish to the Twenty20 game. Other good performances were against Croydon in Round 1, with newly appointed captain Abhi Duseja taking 5/38, Oakleigh in Round 4, where they almost chased down 296, lead by a swashbuckling lower order batting performance of 75 not out from Jas Singh and almost stole the game from Brighton in Round 7.

The 4th XI also won 2 games against Mt Waverley and Kingston Saints in Rounds 10 and 11. They came close to winning their Round 1 game against Croydon on the back of an excellent bowling performance on debut from junior player Will Robertshaw who captured 5/18, including a wicket with his very first ball in senior cricket.

At the end of a very tough and difficult season for the Club, we are able to announce some very positive news of the appointment of Dale Christie from Premier league club Richmond who is joining the club as coach for the upcoming 2012-2013 season and also the recruitment of Jayme Saleem from Premier league club Hawthorn-Monash University and Rohan Wight from Malvern.

As mentioned in last year's annual report, the Club is continuing to head in the right direction. While the results on the scoreboard this season may appear to be slow, these results are being achieved due to the following people who continue to show their commitment and passion to the Ormond Cricket Club:

- Club President Michael Williams, who continues to grow in the role and again led from the front. When the Club faced several difficult challenges this season, Michael made decisions with a very calm and professional attitude.
- Executive Committee member and Recruitment Coordinator Ross Singleton, who did an amazing job in getting several of the above mentioned past players back playing with the club this season, along with his involvement in the successful recruitment of Dale Christie, Jayme Saleem and Rohan Wight to the Club. Due to his outstanding efforts he was a very worthy winner of this season's Best Clubman Award.
- Coach and 1st XI Captain, Michael Hansen, who given the circumstances he faced, did an outstanding job in not only leading the 1st XI, but also managing to have another successful season with the bat. He also provided valuable assistance, guidance and encouragement to several of the junior players who played this season.
- Richard Simon, who continues in the role of Sponsorship Coordinator helping Ormond to maintain and achieve financial stability, especially with the successful establishment of the "Gunn Club".
- Alistair Gordon, in the role of Junior Coordinator, who performed an outstanding job considering he spent the whole season on "one leg" due to a preseason training injury.
- Treasurer, Liam Mulcahy, who continues to do an excellent job in controlling and keeping a close watch on the Club's financial status.
- Executive Committee member, Sean Clark, for his excellent work in managing and establishing the successful transformation of the Club's website and player/supporter communications onto the MyCricket system.
- Darren Stait, who continued his excellent and important role in coaching and developing the Under 15 Hatch representative team and providing future senior players for the Club.
- Executive Committee member, Sam Kindlen, who this season took on the huge task as an Assistant Coach to Michael Hansen and performed very well in the role for someone of his age. He also continued in the role as an assistant coach with the Hatch Under 15 team.
- Ben Cameron, for again providing his time to Sam and Darren in assisting with the Hatch team.
- Steve Ambler, who again performed the roles of 1st XI Team Manager/Scorer, Hatch Team Manager and the Club's "Master chef" in providing meals on a Thursday night after training.
- Bar Manager and "Master chef Apprentice", Russell Oaten, whom the Club can always count on when things need to be done.

- Executive Committee member, Geoff Cowen, whom along with the valuable assistance of John Bolt (father-in-law of Russell) have commenced on the important work of updating the Club's records to be transferred onto the MyCricket system.
- Jeff Mark, for his continued work in preparing the wickets on both grounds at EE Gunn Reserve, especially so this year considering Jeff's battle with serious illness that sidelined him for most of the second half of the season.
- John Morgan and Mick Cahalane, for their excellent support of the Club in their duties as Club Umpires for the 3rd and 4th XI home games.

Also a very big thanks to all the supporters of our Club, especially those ever reliable in, Ted & Lesley Plant (get well soon Ted all our thoughts are with you), Ian & Trish Shields, Franny Oaten & Jo Williams (especially their organising of the afternoon teas on match days), Andrew Isles, Lyn & Mike Patterson, Dawn & Dave Cameron, Terry Lofts, Lindsay Garner, Andrew Gough and finally the Past Players Group, who all do a lot of valuable behind-the-scenes work for the Club.

Also thanks again to Pamela Simon for collating and preparing this Annual Report.

Last, but not forgotten, a huge thank you to our Club Patron, John Craig. 'Craigie' as everyone knows him, continues his excellent role of attending to the "little things" that need to be done around the club, along with his involvement on the VSDCA Executive. As many will know, due to his invaluable service to cricket in this state, John was last year awarded Life Membership of Cricket Victoria. I'm sure you will all agree that John is a very worthy winner of this award.

Congratulations to Cameron Scott on winning the John Robertson Club Champion Trophy for season 2011-2012. As mentioned later in the Annual Report, it was a close race this season with Cameron winning by only 3 points from Coach and 1st XI Captain, Michael Hansen.

Upon winning this season's John Robertson Club Champion Trophy, Cameron created history by joining his grandfather George and father Peter as previous winners of this award.

Congratulations to all our batting/bowling averages winners for this season. Also congratulations must go to the other team captains, Scott McManus who continued on from last season as 2nd XI captain, Abhi Duseja who was appointed 3rd XI captain, but unfortunately withdrew after 2 games due to a season ending injury and Cameron Scott who took over the captaincy of the 4th XI.

As we approach the upcoming 2012-2013 season, there is a lot to like about what is happening at our great Club, and I would like to finish off with this message to all our players, members and supporters.....

Our relationship with the O AFC remains strong, and the work done by Mat Cousins and John Craig in liaising with the Glen Eira City Council is to be commended. We must also acknowledge the strengthening ties with the Ormond-McKinnon Community Bank branch in North Road, Ormond. Richard Simon continues to do a marvelous job in this area. It is important that we support not only this relationship, but also those with all our sponsors.

To your Committee, thank you once again. Each and everyone one of you are focused on the challenges faced by a volunteer group. This was the catalyst for the formation of the "Gunn Club". Another outcome was a clear path to secure an exceptional level of coaching and operational talent for the coming years.

Again, Darren Stait took on the role of coordinating the Ormond RM Hatch U15 representative side. Darren spent much time planning and organising the squad. While the success achieved the previous year was not matched, you will read later on that it is still a very important step in developing better cricketers in the region. Again, Darren was ably supported by Steve Ambler, Ben Cameron and Sam Kindlen.



This year we had Lewis Johnston come to the Ormond Cricket Club from England. Lewis selflessly helped out with juniors and anything else that was asked of him. I hope Lewis enjoyed Ormond as much as we enjoyed having him around.

I must also thank the Wylie family who were able to provide accommodation for Lewis whilst he played cricket at Ormond. I hope Lewis will continue to follow our Club, as we will certainly follow him.

COACH'S REPORT

- Take our catches (cannot be dropping 3 catches a game)
- Consistently hit top of off-stump or just outside off stump when bowling

It is a simple game plan but can be difficult to execute. But we now have the bowlers to execute this and a top 3 batsmen recruited to help strengthen the batting. And catches, never forget the catches and there will be lots of catching.

Special thanks to Steve Ambler for his great work as our scorer and Team Manager and the Committee for their support and commitment for the Club to be making the current decisions to become successful.

The draw indicated we were to play four consecutive games during the first week of the tournament which, given the day consists of 90 overs, was going to test both the fitness and concentration levels of the boys. Unfortunately, the main problem was our batting, as although we managed to bat into the 40 odd over mark, as in our three losses, we failed to build partnerships and escalate the run rate late in the innings. This was an aspect of the game coach Stait stressed right throughout the tournament.

Jonty Sharman-Smith was the only batsman to score over 100 runs for the tournament, with the next best being the very entertaining and unorthodox Braydon Mancal with 82 runs and James Batholomeusz with 70 runs. Jack McCambley opened the innings in each game, batted for long periods, taking the shine off the new ball and contributing over 50 runs.

As suggested earlier, the bowling was steady with Jonty being our leading wicket taker with 7 wickets at 16.3 and Pat Scott opening the bowling and chipping in with 6 wickets at 20.8. Not only does the Hatch competition require a commitment from the players, it also does from the parents during the training sessions and over the two weeks in January.

It was also pleasing to have the umpiring services of a couple of old Ormond 'cricket legends' in Rod Chisholm & Steve Jackson! Sadly they failed to realise we were the side wearing the black shorts!!

The boys representing Ormond are so fortunate to be exposed to the coaching ability, cricket knowledge and communication skills of head coach, Darren Stait. Just a pity his tired old jokes aren't of the same quality!! Two fine young men in batting coach Sam Kindlen and bowling coach Ben Cameron ably assisted him. All three find the time to put in many hours during the pre tournament training sessions and on match days.

Thanks to the senior arm of the Ormond Cricket Club and the Committee who have always provided the resources and supported the Hatch competition.

Although the results weren't ideal, well done to all the boys who represented Ormond and who certainly played the game in the right spirit.

As with many of the boys it was their first taste of turf cricket so I hope it was a valuable learning experience for them.

Family tradition lives on at Ormond

Cricket

CAMERON Scott continued a family tradition when he won Ormond Cricket Club's club champion award.

The Fourth XI captain and 20-year Ormond player edged out firsts skipper and former Premier batsman Michael Hansen by three points, 538 to 535.

In doing so he joined his grandfather George and his father, Peter, as Monders club champions.

George Scott was a foundation member of Ormond and a vice-president. He was also a member of the Monders' first First XI premiership team in 1947/48 and later captained the seconds and thirds and was a leading wicket-taker.

In his last season of cricket he took a staggering 72 scalps at an average of 6.8, a record until Alan Doble's 75-wicket harvest in 1974-75.

Peter Scott played for the club for

more than 50 years and won his club championship in 1983/84.

In 2009 he was selected to tour England with the Australian Over 60s team but withdrew with health problems.

Cameron, 31, an all-rounder, said it was a thrill to follow in the steps of his grandfather and father.

"Dad was very proud," he said.

Peter told the Leader: "It's probably unique. I've never heard of it happening anywhere else."

Meanwhile two of Ormond's six junior teams won premierships in the City of Moorabbin Cricket Association: Twilight U14A and U12A team.

It added to the excitement being felt around the club from the appointment of Richmond Premier player Dale Christie as senior coach and the recruitment of Hawthorn-Monash University Premier fast bowler Jamie Saleem.

Hansen will continue as First XI captain in 2012/13.



JUNIOR SECTION REPORT

Overview

The Junior Section fielded six sides and, although this was arguably half a team less than the previous season, it was an extremely successful season. There were 76 juniors enrolled this season.

The highlight of the season was having four teams playing in the finals, with three competing in grand finals and two sides winning flags (some of the players pictured right with the Premiership Shields).

This is seen as a breakthrough result for the club. For a number of years we have been competitive in finals but it has been a while since a premiership has been won.



We fielded three U12 sides, two U14 and one U16 side. These sides were complete Ormond sides. Some sides had thirteen players and the challenge was to give each player a fair amount of time both batting and bowling and in most cases this was achieved, especially in the lower age groups.

Our U16 side competed in B grade and struggled throughout the season with only three second year U16 players. With a strong group coming up from U14's and the experience gained by the U16 players we should be able to field two competitive sides in this age group next season.

Both U14 sides, B & D Grade Twilight, played in the grand finals. Both sides played well during the semifinals to gain a spot in the Grand Final. Unfortunately our U14B side was bowled out cheaply and if it weren't for a terrific maiden 50 from Sam Sofrinidis the score would have been very uncompetitive. Although the boys bowled well, they were overtaken with three overs to spare and three wickets in hand. Our U14A's had a well-deserved win against Le Page Park making 129 runs on a huge ground; they bowled Le Page out for 83 runs. Awesome effort by both sides.

Two of our U12 sides competed in finals. Our U12C side, consisting of first year players only, took on D Grade (East) where they came up against a number of sides with players 2 years older than them. Although they initially struggled, they became more competitive as the season progressed. Our U12B's played in C Grade (East) and there were some initial concerns about their ability to be competitive. These fears were unfounded as they finished third on the ladder. They won their first final but couldn't go on to win the prelim. Great season guys. Our U12A side competed in A grade, the first team to do so in a number of years. Initially it was suggested that the team was graded too high, however the guys achieved the ultimate and won the flag.
